Notice Regarding Enforcement of Parked Cars Encroaching on Sidewalks

We have observed, in many neighborhoods, cars parked with wheels up on the curb and encroaching into sidewalks. This creates a dangerous situation where pedestrians are forced off of the sidewalk and into the street. Parking a vehicle in a way that inhibits full use of the sidewalk isn't just illegal – it causes sidewalks to be less safe and accessible, especially for those using wheelchairs and strollers and those who are visually impaired.

A vehicle parked in violation of the Town's municipal code can be cited and/or towed, even if the sidewalk is partially clear, or if a vehicle is parked in a driveway, extending out into the sidewalk. Furthermore, parking in way that causes blockage of the sidewalk violates the rights of those with disabilities to use the sidewalks free of hazards, as established in the Americans With Disabilities Act.

The Town has asked the Central Marin Police Authority (CMPA) to enforce the municipal code sections that refer to parked cars impeding full use of the sidewalk, or otherwise blocking public rights of way in designated "no stopping" zones.

Corte Madera municipal code 10.40.020: Stopping or standing in parkways. No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle within any parkway. (Ord. 461 § 10.1, 1966)

Corte Madera municipal code 10.40.030 - No stopping zones and no parking areas maintenance.

The traffic engineer is authorized to maintain, by appropriate signs or by paint upon the curb surface, all no stopping zones, no parking areas, and restricted parking areas, as defined and described in this title or any ordinance or resolution of the town.

When said curb markings or signs are in place no operator of any vehicle shall stop, stand or park such vehicle adjacent to any such legible curb marking or sign in

violation of any of the provisions of this title. (Ord. 461 § 10.2, 1966)

Please remember that the purpose of these laws is to ensure the right of safe passage for you and your neighbors – please respect them.



As an example:

The car on the left may receive a warning or citation.

The car on the right may be cited or towed.

ARE YOU SIGNED UP for one of the upcoming Certified Comprehensive First Aid Trainings (CCFA)

In our continuing commitment to emergency preparedness the Town of Corte Madera is sponsoring training classes for community members. This is one of the many ongoing efforts townwide to build community awareness, preparation and resilience.

- The 5-hour class is certified (2 years) by the American Safety and Health Institute (ASHI)
- The course material covers child & adult CPR, appropriate use of Automated External Defribillators (AEDs), how to manage blood borne pathogens, appropriate skilled first-aid training, and coordination and interaction with badged firstresponders
- · The course is hands-on, interactive and focused
- The course will give special attention to our local vulnerabilities of fire and earthquake response
- · Beverages and snacks will be provided
- Please wear comfortable shoes and clothing and be prepared to be engaged!
- · Participants completing the course will receive a home first-aid kit


