Practice Drills for Disaster Response

ATTENTION EVERYONE Mark your calendars for this Sunday

Please don't be alarmed if you see neighbors walking outside wearing vests, back packs and hard hats, speaking into hand-held radios this Sunday morning (9AM to 12PM).

No. It's not a giant scavenger hunt.

It's some of the 41 Neighborhood Response Groups in Larkspur, Greenbrae and Corte Madera practicing their shelter-in-place response team skills and testing their communication lines within their neighborhoods and to Central Marin Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Command Post.

Why Organize?

In the case of a major earthquake, Marin's first responders will be overwhelmed. They emphasize that all residents must be prepared to survive (food, water, shelter, medical equipment) for 5-7 days in their homes following a disaster. Now that firestorms are also a reality in our area, we need to understand about emergency alerts, how to prepare on high risk fire days and how to escape. As neighbors we can help each other prepare and mitigate fire risks as a community.

What are NRGs?

Started in 2007, Central Marin Neighborhood Response Groups (NRGs) are **grassroots-led** neighborhood groups in Larkspur, Corte Madera and Greenbrae that prepare as a community for two disaster scenarios (major earthquake & wildfire evacuation). We have 41 NRGs covering 60% of households in Central Marin.

We believe we can take responsibility to prepare ourselves as best we can for both scenarios. And we can help each other as neighbors. The Central Marin NRG program is not merely a distribution of information. Its strength and longevity is based on the social cohesion of neighbors who have a good reason to get to know each other despite our busy lives - to help look out for one another and our families when we can't be with our loved ones when and if disaster strikes.


Lottery Drawing - Below Market Rate Townhome at the Strand

Marin Housing's Below Market Rate Homeownership Program offers low to moderate income, first-time homebuyers the opportunity to purchase one of the 350 BMR properties throughout Marin County at prices that are substantially lower than market value.

When one of these homes becomes available for sale, a lottery is held and names are drawn from a list of

Town Manager Cusimano: Cusimano reported that the first working group meeting on the Town Hall Addition Project was recently held and he stated he was looking forward to problem solving the matters of this project with the group. He mentioned that the Town budgets money from the Sales Tax Measure for fire prevention, disaster preparedness and vegetation management. The Town will be using those funds to continue those efforts. Additionally, Mrs. Marla Orth will be assisting staff with trainings for the community, the upcoming chipper program and with helping neighborhoods become nationally recognized by Firewise USA just like Meadowcrest Ridge. Lastly, Cusimano reported that a bid for an early warning system will be brought to the Town Council very soon.

Councilmember Kunhardt: Regarding transportation, Kunhardt mentioned that repairs on the Richmond-San Rafael Bridge will begin soon. Route 37 has been closed on and off and currently, there isn't a clear solution to the flooding problem. However, there is an MOU that has been authorized to be signed between the Transportation Authority of Marin (TAM) and the counties of Marin, Napa, Solano and Sonoma. The MOU would initiate a study of the environmental aspect of segment A of Route 37 which is the segment between the Sonoma Raceway and highway 101. He reported that TAM a \$600,000 contribution towards the Yellow School Bus program. The on-ramp metering program will begin next month starting in Sausalito and heading Northbound, the planning for the Highway 101 and I-580 connection is proceeding in the design process and the work on the Novato Narrows that was authorized by transportation legislation will begin at the end of the year. Lastly, the Safe Routes to School Program is looking to improve their service to the high schools due to the increase in the number of students and the lack of parking space. Kunhardt also mentioned the Renewable Energy Stakeholders Working Group and

they have been coming up with solutions in advancing renewable energy.

Councilmember Beckman: Beckman introduced Katherine Chan whom he stated is a new Trustee for the Larkspur-Corte Madera School District and who also serves as the liaison to the Town Council representing the school district. He mentioned he would review the minutes to meetings he was unable to attend and would report on those meetings at the next Council meeting. He mentioned attending the working group meeting for the Town Hall addition project and said he felt it was a positive meeting overall.

Councilmember Bailey: He reported attending the Central Marin Fire Council, Central Marin Police Council, MCCMC Legislative Committee, Marin County Council of Mayors and Councilmembers (MCCMC) and Marin Clean Energy (MCE) meetings. On the Fire Council, he and Mayor Ravasio witnessed the badge pinning of the new Deputy Fire Chief Don Stasiowski. He added that Central Marin Fire has been given the LAFCO exemption and there were several CalPERS, pension and other benefits that were approved at the meeting. For the Police Council, he also attended with Mayor Ravasio. They received the financial audit for FY 2017-2018, discussed strategic planning for 2019 and approved making Mayor Ravasio as Chair of the council. For the MCCMC Legislative Committee, he announced he has been appointed as the Vice-Chair and there are lots of new bills that have been introduced. For MCCMC, he mentioned Senator McGuire gave an extensive report to the group and he is happy to share a summary on what McGuire talked about if anyone is interested. For MCE, Solano County has been approved to join MCE and the group has been discussing a policy on handling the reserves for the organization.

Mayor Ravasio: He reported attending the Fire and Police Council meetings with Councilmember Bailey. He also attended a Twin Cities Disaster Preparedness Monthly Meeting. He stated 62% of the homes in the area are involved in NRGs. He mentioned a practice evacuation drill will be held on Sunday and he commented that the meeting participants at the were excited to know that Corte Madera is starting the chipper program.
